ISRAEL MINISTRY TRIP

**PROGRAM ITINERARY**

DAY	DATE	PROGRAM	OVERNIGHT
1	Feb. 18 Sat.	<b>Travel Day</b> Flights to Israel	
2	Feb. 19 Sun	Arrival at Ben Gurion, Tel Aviv. After claiming our luggage meet the One For Israel representative and gather with other group members to transfer (late afternoon) to our hotel on the coast of the <b>Mediterranean</b> . In the evening an orientation meeting to get to know the other tour participants and meet staff from <b>One for Israel</b> .	<b>Netanya: Seasons Hotel or similar</b>
3	Feb. 20 Mon	We begin our day at the <b>Israel College of Bible</b> to learn about the ministry of <b>One for Israel</b> . We'll help with service projects either at the College or delivering food parcels to a local community center for the elderly. In the afternoon visit <b>Caesarea Maratima</b> , site of major events in the lives of Peter and Paul followed by a visit to the famous <b>Roman Aqueducts</b> built by Herod the Great. <b>Evening speaker: One for Israel staff</b>	Netanya: Seasons Hotel or similar
4	Feb. 21 Tues	Today we'll visit <b>Mt. Carmel</b> where Elijah faced off against the prophets of Baal. Continue to <b>Nazareth</b> , Jesus' boyhood home town where we will enjoy a tour of <b>Nazareth Village</b> – a reenactment of first-century life in the town where Yeshua grew up. We'll have a chance to serve at the Village by dressing up in period costumes, as backdrops as their guides teach various groups about Yeshua. Others may choose to visit a local hospital to encourage and pray for sick children and the elderly. We'll have a chance to hear about the ministry of a local Arab pastor. 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5	<b>Feb. 22</b> Wed	<p>We will begin our day with a <b>boat ride</b> on the Sea of Galilee, and view the <b>ancient fishing boat</b> found 30 years ago, sunk in the Sea of Galilee. We will also stop at ancient <b>Magdala</b>, the home of Mary Magdalene and visit <b>Tabgha</b>, where Church tradition remembers the <b>multiplication of the loaves and fishes</b>. Next we'll stop along the shore of the Sea at the <b>Primacy of Peter</b>, the site where Yeshua called Peter to ministry, for a time of meditation on the events recorded in John 21. After enjoying a <b>fish lunch</b> (included), we'll explore the town of <b>Capernaum</b> with its ancient <b>synagogue</b> and the site of many of Yeshua's miracles. As time permits, we'll visit the excavations at <b>Bethsaida</b>, home of four of Yeshua's disciples and <b>Kursi</b>, where Yeshua cast demons into swine.</p> <p>Evening speaker: One for Israel Staff</p>	Sea of Galilee Area: Maagan Holiday Village or similar
6	<b>Feb. 23</b> Thurs	<p>Today we visit Northern Galilee. Making our first stop at <b>Tel Hazor</b>, we learn about the Israelite conquests of the Promised Land, before continuing to <b>Tel Dan</b>, where the tribe of Dan settled. We will <b>hike</b> into a forest preserve to see the ruins of Jeroboam's alternate temple (1 K 12:26-31). Visit <b>Caesarea Philippi</b> (Banias Spring) at the base of <b>Mt. Hermon</b>, where Peter confessed, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God (Mt. 16:16). On our way back, we pass through more of the Golan Heights, stopping at Mt. Bental, to gain a greater understanding its strategic importance to Israel.</p>	Maagan, or similar, Sea of Galilee Area
7	<b>Feb. 24</b> Fri.	<p>This morning, we drive along the <b>Jordan River</b>, on our way to <b>Beit Shean</b>, to see the expansive excavations taking place at this ancient Roman Decapolis city. You'll have the opportunity to hike to the top of the ancient tel where the bodies of Saul and Jonathan were hung by the Philistines. Follow the Jordan River toward <b>Qasr al Yahud</b> in the area where the Israelites crossed the Jordan to enter the promised land and also the place of Yeshua's baptism. We will have a baptismal service for those who wish. Continue along the <b>Dead Sea</b>, the lowest place on earth, for a float.</p>	Kalia Holiday Village or similar (Dead Sea Region)
8	<b>Feb. 25</b> Sat	<p>After an early breakfast, we will make our way to Masada. Ascending by cable car, or maybe a hike, we visit the remnants of Herod's Palace and where in 73 A.D. the Zealots made their last stand against the might of Rome. Following our visit to Masada, we return to <b>En Gedi</b>, where we will hike to the Waterfalls of David. We proceed northward to <b>Qumran</b> where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found in 1947. We'll make a stop in the wilderness for all brave souls who wish to ride a camel. Now it's time to "go up" to <b>Jerusalem</b>. We will enter the city as</p>	<b>Jerusalem Dan Boutique or similar</b>

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pilgrims did since ancient times to fulfill the words of the prophet, “I was glad when they said unto me: ‘Our feet shall stand within your Gates, O Jerusalem’” (Ps. 122:1-2). We will have a panoramic view of the **Old City and Temple Mount** from **Mt. Scopus** before checking into our hotel.

9	Feb. 26 Sun.	Begin the day with a prayer walk through some of the neighborhoods of Jerusalem, ending at the Jerusalem Prayer Tower where we can spend time interceding for the city. Travel to <b>Bethlehem</b> for a visit to the Church of the Nativity. Then we will continue on to the <b>Shepherd’s Fields</b> where the angels announced the birth of our Savior. Have lunch with members of a <b>local Palestinian</b> church and pray with them. You’ll also have time to visit one of Bethlehem’s many <b>olive wood stores</b> . In the late afternoon those who want can attend the English service at the <b>King of Kings</b> congregation.	JERUSALEM: DAN BOUTIQUE OR SIMILAR
10	Feb. 27 Mon.	Today we visit many of the places associated with the Temple and Jesus’ last days leading up to His crucifixion. Begin the day at Temple Mount and visit the <b>Pools of Bethesda and a time of worship at St. Anne’s Church</b> . Continue to the <b>Mt. of Olives</b> with its spectacular <b>panorama</b> , and hike the “ <b>Palm Sunday Walk</b> ” to the <b>Garden of Gethsemane</b> . Along the way we visit <b>Dominus Flevit</b> , and the <b>Church of All Nations and The Garden of Gethsemane</b> . In the afternoon travel to Beth Shemesh, where we’ll partner with the <b>Joshua Fund project</b> to pack and deliver food parcels. Visit the valley where David fought Goliath, before returning to Jerusalem. Dinner this evening will “on your own” so that you can explore some of Jerusalem’s many varied ethnic restaurants. 11	Feb. 28 Tues	Today we will begin with a time of reflection at the <b>Garden Tomb</b> . We tour the Jewish Quarter with its <b>ancient Cardo, the Broad Wall, and the Temple Institute</b> which displays vessels prepared to go in the new Temple. We’ll have a time of personal prayer at the <b>Western Wall</b> prayer area and tour the <b>Western Wall Tunnels</b> , that trace Herod’s great retaining wall underneath today’s Moslem Quarter. Afterward we’ll tour the <b>Sisters of Zion Convent</b> and <b>Ecce Homo Arch. Walk down the Via Dolorosa to Church of the Holy Sepulcher</b> . The afternoon free for shopping or visiting other sites of personal interest. <sup>1</sup> In the evening we’ll gather for a final time of worship and sharing as we prepare for tomorrow’s departure. <sup>1</sup> Other sites of interest might include the City of David, including Hezekiah’s tunnel and the Pool of Siloam; the Tower of David museum or the Israel Museum or the Holocaust Museum (Yad Vashem).



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<b>12</b>	<b>Mar 1</b> <b>Wed.</b>	Transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for our flight home, with wonderful memories of our encounter with the Land of the Bible. Those flying out later in the evening may choose to visit Tel Aviv or Jaffa/Joppa (on your own).
